In 2015, I was invited to participate in the Setouchi Triennale 2016 in Kagawa, Japan. My project was to use an old warehouse and transform it into a movie theatre based on several lost 42^{nd} Street Theatres.

The project is called Island Theatre Megi, and the theatre opened on March 20, 2016. Visitors can experience the old 42^{nd} Street theatre atmosphere with my murals and paintings on the walls, sit on 1950's vintage theatre seats (from the Historic Hemet Theatre) and watch my video documentary, "Last Days of 42^{nd} Street" as well as silent film shorts.

It has been my dream to create my own movie theatre since my college days at Tyler School of Art.
